Attendance and Lates Our attendance at present is 96.12%, which is just above the government's target of 96%. Please could you make sure you try to avoid taking children out of school for appointments before 9.00am or 1.00pm during term time unless it is absolutely necessary.



Please note that all children are expected to be in school in the morning before 8.50am, which is the time the gate closes. After this time they are marked late in the register. All classes have 'early work' in class between 8.40am and 9.00am or reading. This time is important for children to settle and get sorted for

the start of the school day and it is an opportunity for them to read, practise their spellings, timestables or other essential skills. Please make sure your child doesn't miss out!

EYFS and KS1 Book Bags

Please ensure that your childrens book bags are in school everyday. We are very excited to have invested in a new range of RWI and Library books for the children to enjoy. These will be closely matched to their reading abilities. The children will be bringing home three different type of books.



The first book will link to their current phonics or reading groups at school. The second book will be chosen by your child and could be more challenging including vocabulary which may not be decodable. The third book is a sharing book for you to all enjoy at home.
