Dear Parents and Carers,

<u>Library Reminder!</u> We are continuing our scheme to open the library to family groups. If you would like to come in and change your child/children's books, please book a slot on the Parents Evening section of **Parentmail.** The following measures will be put in place for everyone's safety:



- books that are returned to school will not be put back into circulation for at least 7 days after their return to school;
- families will be asked to wash/sanitize their hands before going into the library and when they leave school;
- social distancing will be in place between adults and children who are currently in school;
- slots are available between 10:00am-12.00pm on Tuesdays and Thursdays and 1.00-2.30pm on Wednesdays, to enable us to manage social distancing at the beginning and end of the school day;
- there will be 5 minutes between slots to facilitate social distancing.

We are happy to talk through things and offer support for children who are finding things difficult. We have adapted home learning packs and made special packs for children who are finding things too challenging. Class teachers are
